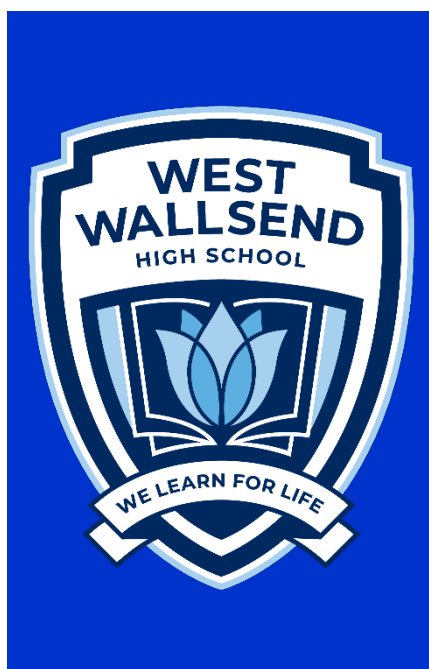
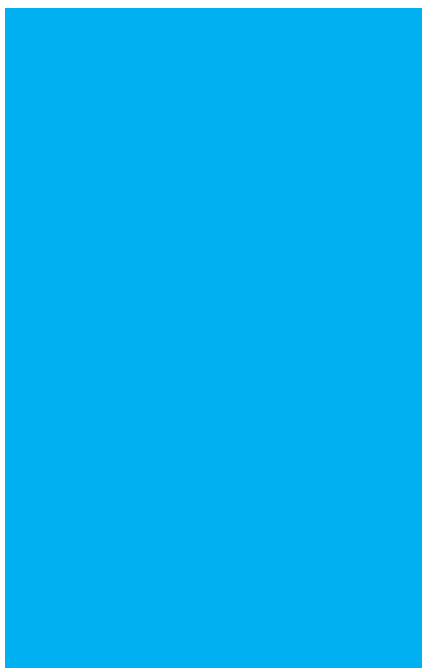

2024 Year 7 Spark (HPGE Program) Important Dates

- **Friday 5 May** – Phase 1, Section A and B returned to primary school
- **Friday 9 June** – Phase 2, Section C completed by primary school and submitted to West Wallsend High School
- **Wednesday 21 June** – Phase 3, Spark full-day in-take session (by invitation only)
- **Friday 9 October** – Phase 4, students notified in writing of place in Spark class for 2024

High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) Program

The High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) processes embedded at West Wallsend High School acknowledges our commitment to high quality educational outcomes for all high potential and gifted learners.

As such, the Year 7 Spark class (HPGE) provides young people with access to a differentiated classroom environment which provides students with additional opportunities to ‘spark’ their talents in the intellectual, creative, social-emotional and physical domains of learning. Students in the Spark class have access to a homeroom and talent development opportunities, including individual mentorship, and differentiated teaching and learning practices, ensuring that their specific learning and wellbeing needs are met. **Placement in the Year 7 Spark class is through Year 6 application only.**

West Wallsend High School engages in the holistic recognition of HPGE potential through a student portfolio, Spark in-take day and interview process. This is in addition to the use of academic data provided by primary schools and parents/carers and primary staff statements of support.

Selection criteria used to determine Spark class placement

- Strong academic performance across a range of subjects
- High potential in one or more HPGE domains (intellectual, creative, social-emotional, physical)
- High performance in one or more fields of talent (academic, arts, business and entrepreneurship, leadership, science and technology, sport)
- Solid literacy and numeracy skills
- Ability to be a self-reflective learner
- Ability to be a critical thinker
- High level of self-motivation
- Positive attitudes to school and learning
- Positive behaviours which enhance learning
- High levels of creativity evident in learning tasks

How does my young person apply for the Spark class in 2024?

Phase 1 –

Please complete **Section A and Section B** and return to your primary school Principal by **Friday 5 May 2023**. As part of this, please submit your portfolio which needs to include the following:

- A 2023 sample of original writing completed by the student in their own handwriting
- A 2023 sample of a completed task in mathematics
- A 2023 sample of a completed task in science
- A 2023 sample of a completed task in social science
- A sample of any other work chosen by the student to show ability in other areas
- Copies of recent certificates for competitions, awards, etc.
- Most recent school report (please do not send originals)
- Year 3 & 5 NAPLAN results (please do not send originals)

Phase 2 –

The primary school Principal (or classroom teacher) will complete **Section C** to endorse your application for the Spark class. They will then forward your Section A, B and C with your portfolio to the Spark Program Coordinator, Ms Lauren Holding, West Wallsend High School, 20 Appletree Road, West Wallsend 2286, by **Friday 9 June 2023**.

Phase 3 –

The Spark Panel (consisting of the Year 7, 2024 Deputy Principal, 2024 Year Advisor and Head Teacher Instructional Practice) will receive the applications and invite successful students to a full-day Spark in-take session at West Wallsend High School on **Wednesday 21 June 2023**.

When students receive notification of a position at the Spark in-take session, they will receive further information regarding how to effectively prepare for this. Essentially, students will be involved in a full-day workshop focused on independent and group critical and creative thinking skills. Furthermore, they will engage in an individual interview with a panel of staff from West Wallsend High School. During this interview, we would like to get to know your young person better, talk through their work in their portfolio and discuss their learning goals and interests.

Please note, not all students who apply for the Spark class will receive a position in the Spark in-take session. Students who were not successful in obtaining a place in this session will be notified of this in writing.

Phase 4 –

Successful students will be notified in writing by **Friday 9 October 2023**. Where the number of short-listed students exceeds the number of places available, a reserve list will be established.

No further information about the reserve list will be available following initial notification in writing. Should a place become available those placed on the reserve list will be notified immediately in rank order.

Parents/carers must confirm an offer of enrolment by the date indicated in the notification letter. Failure to do so will cancel the offer and allow the place to be made available to another student.

Placement in the Spark class is competitive, and merit based. Students in this class are individually case managed by Spark staff throughout their learning journey and parent/carers will be notified if we have any concerns so that additional supports may be put in place.

Appeals can only be made regarding the process and should be made to Krystal Bevin, Principal, West Wallsend High School, 20 Appletree Road, West Wallsend 2286.

Please note –

Students who are unable to apply by the timeline outlined above are eligible to apply through the special consideration process. This may include students who move into the West Wallsend High School enrolment area later in the year or students who currently do not attend our partner primary schools. In this circumstance, please complete Section A, B and C of the application and submit it directly to the Office at West Wallsend High School with the following note – Attention Lauren Holding – 2024 Spark Special Consideration Application.

If their application progresses through to the next phase, parents/carers will then be contacted directly to invite their young person to be involved in an alternative Spark-in take session. Parents/carers will be contacted, in writing, if their young person's application was successful before the end of the 2023 school year.
